National Await BC Runners

The men's and women's indoor track & field teams certainly have been racing around lately. Competing in the Georgia Dome Collegiate Invitational on Friday, Feb. 26, in Atlanta, GA, the teams outdistanced themselves. Outstanding performances were turned in by many.

Aimee Salzer finished 4th in the women's 5,000-meter run with a time of 18:53.36. This finish marks the 2nd fastest time in the country for a junior college athlete. Previously, in February's Virginia Tech Invitational in Blacksburg, VA, Aimee Salzer and Meadow Mielke both qualified for the national championships in

the women's 3,000-meter run.

Also at the Georgia Invitational, Justin Turner and Bereket Kiflu qualified for the national championships in the 5,000-meter run as they ran 15:13.92 and 15:16.94 and finished 2nd and 3rd in the meet. Jamar Bryson was 4th in the mile run and just missed qualifying for nationals with a time of 4:22.59.

Kobie Purnell won his heat of the 60-meter hurdles. Also winning his heat in the 60-meter dash was Landell Jacobs. In the finals, Kobie false started the hurdles. Landell placed 5th and Tim Vaught 6th in the 60-meter dash. Tim Vaught was 4th in the 400-meter run.

second victory of the season on the mound in relief of freshman John Shirk. Sophomore Scott Auton led BC at the plate with a 3 for 4 effort and 3 RBI's. Freshmen Billy Hayes and David Tollison each had 2 hits for BC in the second game.

The BC Men's Basketball Team will be back in action on Thursday afternoon at Walters State Community College in Morristown, Tennessee, beginning at 1 p.m. and will be back home on Saturday for a doubleheader with Wilkes Community College also beginning at 1 p.m.
