Hillary Clinton

Abortion: She is in favor of abortion rights, and supports Roe v. Wade. Education: Believes No Child Left Behind has potential if it is better funded, and wants to see much higher investment in public schools so that children can meet their potential.

Iraq: Does not support the war. Clinton, if elected, would have plans to pull all troops out of Iraq within her first 60 days of being in office.

LGBT Rights: She believes the definition of marriage has no business in the constitution. Clinton is a supporter of civil unions, and wants to have equal rights and benefits for all couples.
