Brevard authorities issued a warrant this week to Brevard College student Antonio Lawyne WIlliams for possession of a gun on educational property.

Williams has been arrested and has also been suspended from school and banned from the Brevard College campus.

The arrest came after Campus Life received notice last week that there was a gun on campus.

A joint investigation by

Campus Life and Brevard College Security determined that there had been a gun on campus.

The offending student was then arrested and put on indefinite suspension by the school.

In a startement issued by the college, President Drew Van Horn said that he is "extremely pleased with how Campus Life and Brevard College Security handled this matter," and is "confident about the safety of all who work and study here at Brevard."
