Campus debate favors students' rights

By a ten-to-one margin, students who attended an open-forum debate think students at Brevard College should be afforded the same constitutional rights that protect students at public institutions.

At the 23rd Debate Forum Wednesday, students voted 45-4 in favor of the resolution, "Although attending a private, liberal arts institution, students at Brevard College should enjoy the same constitutional guarantees and protections as those students attending public four-year colleges and universities." Turn-out for the debate was one of the largest in recent memory, said Michael

Spradlin, president of the Brevard Debate Society, which co-sponsored the event with Young Politicians of America.

The debate occurred just weeks after an underground

zine, "The Pupil's Underground," was barred from distribution on campus because it was not a recognized student organization. The
