Women's basketball ready to start season

In the tournament held at Carson-Newman College, the Tornados will take on Lees-McRae College and Lander University. The Tornados return two of their top three scorers in junior forward Samantha Winn (10 points per game) and sophomore Amanda Whitaker (7.7 points per game.)

The rest of the team features a large collection of young players with six freshman on the roster, with another four being sophomores. The only upperclassmen on the team are juniors Winn (Candler, North Carolina) and classmate Millie Wharton (Brisbane, Australia).

While there are few very home games on the schedule before the Christmas Break, the Tornados will host Virginia Intermont on November 25th and Converse College on November 29th. Also on the early part of the season is a conference matchup at Tusculum College on December 6th. Once

down to Columbia, SC to take on the Columbia College, who had defeated B.C. earlier in the season. Early on in the match it looked like history would repeat itself as the Fighting Koalas took the first two sets by scores of 19-25 and 22-25.
