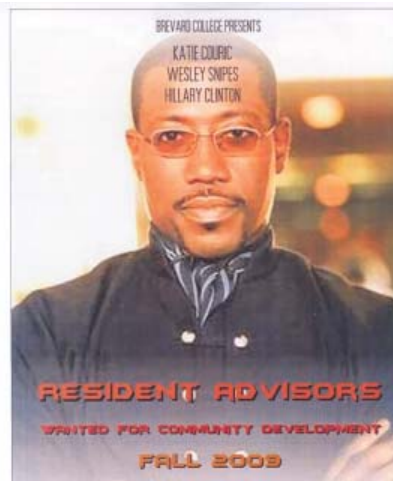


American Heroes
