Football jumps out to strong start

It looks like the fourth time's the charm for BC football.

Now in its' fourth season, The Tornados' football squad has started off the year 3-0, beating their opponents by a combined score of 118 to 33.

Contrast this to the first three seasons of Brevard College football where we posted a combined record of 5 wins and 24 losses.

win streak since the team returned to action, but they are also nationally ranked in many offensive and defensive categories. According to the NCAA Division II website, the Tornados are just out of the top-50 in national rankings for total offense and

are ranked number one nationally in rushing offense.

Brevard also ranks 13th nationally in both run and total defense.

Tomorrow, the Tornados look to continue their unbeaten streak and improve their record to 4-0 against Southern Virginia University. SVU is off to a

much slower start than BC, having dropped all three games this season.
