Shrink and stretch wrap, (no plastic food wrap)
Bubble wrap
Shopping bags

Dry cleaning bags

PAPER

Flattened clean cardboard
Newspaper, magazines, mail
Paper food boxes-liner removed
Clean milk cartons, juice boxes
Clean frozen food boxes

Shredded paper-in clear plastic bag

METAL

Aluminum, steel & tin cans
Ferrous metal (sticks to a magnet)

GLASS
