In the year 312 the emperor of Rome – Constantine – converted to Christianity. That made celebrating the holiday easier. His old religion had a festival for the sun god, Mithra, on December 25. He changed that to Christmas Day. The first calendar with the Christmas Day on it was in the year 350.
