spondence. This is essential to keeping your process organized and productive.

10. Resume. It's the last on the list, but still indispensable. And, it has to be GREAT. Be sure your final resume is carefully edited and succinct (no more than two pages) with a layout that is easy for the eye to follow.

"It may take some time to produce these documents and to learn how to use them effectively," Myers says, "but it will be worth it. Building a satisfying career is much easier when you have the right tools."
