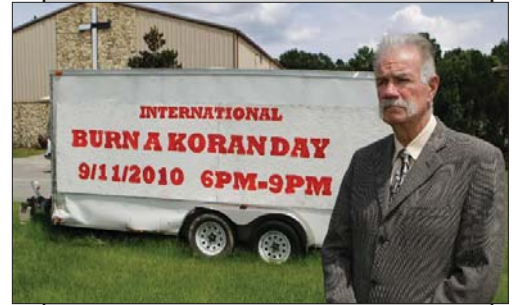

Junior **Carlton Ramsey** remembers, "I came home from school and my parents sat me down to talk to me about what happened. They said a lot of people had been killed for no good reason and that we were going to church to pray about it."
