followed her own interests and  
entered a dramatic school in  
New York City. She studied and  
played in stock companies until  
she is now ranked with such ar-  
tists as Cornelia Otis Skinner  
and Ruth Draper.

Miss Welty recently revealed  
her unusual dramatic talents in  
her portrayal of "The Madonna"  
in Max Reinhardt's production  
"The Miracle." It was while  
playing with the Pasadena Play-  
ers in California, that Max  
Reinhardt made her a present of  
the cross which she wore in one  
of the scenes in which she ap-  
peared on our stage Friday morn-  
ing. She values this gift not  
for its intrinsic value, but "be-  
cause it was given to her by one  
so sweet and one who was such  
a dear."
