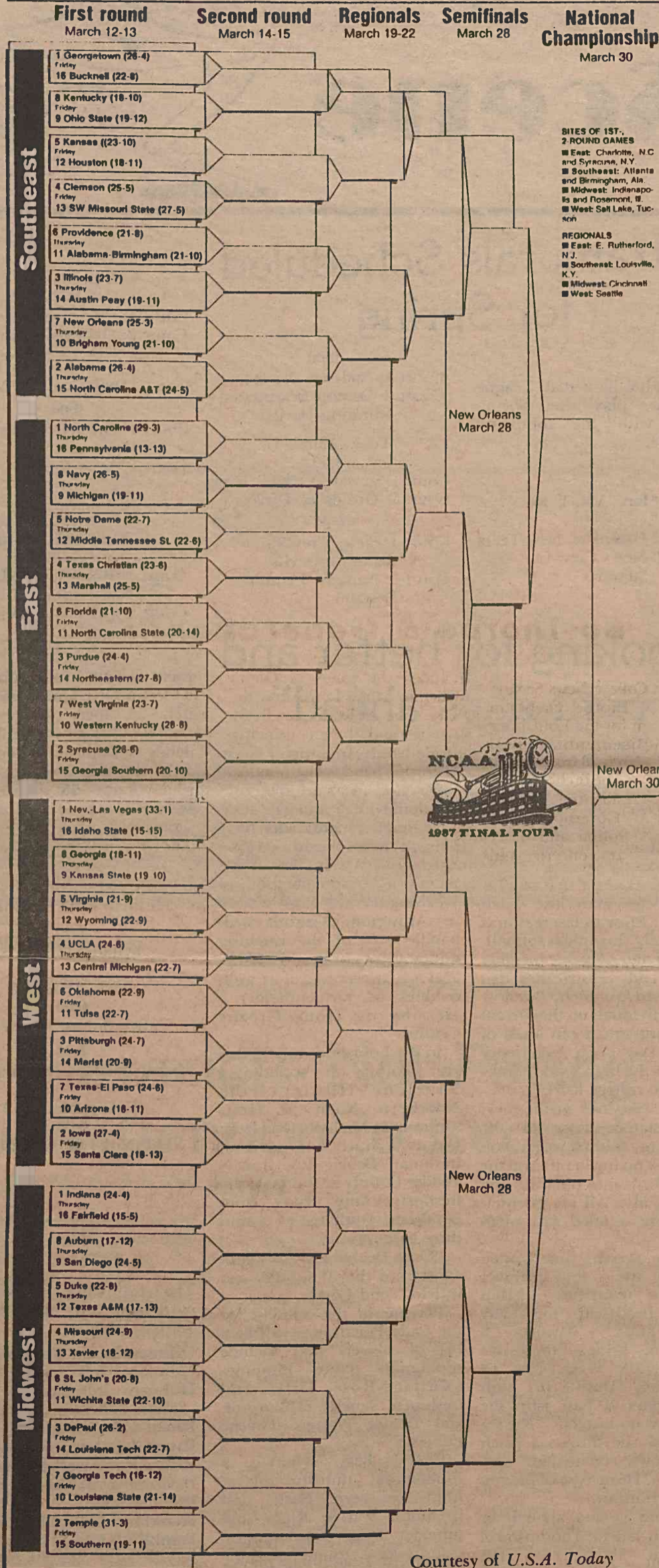

### Students to get AIDS test

BRADENTON, Fla. — At least 23 high school students will be tested for AIDS and hepatitis because a health teacher giving a blood test pricked their fingers with the same syringe, officials said Thursday. The syringe was sterilized each time but the alcohol used doesn't kill all viruses.

### Confederate flag opposed

GREENVILLE, S.C. — The NAACP wants officials to remove the Confederate flags that fly over the state capitols in South Carolina and Alabama. The banners are symbols of "divisiveness, racial animosity and an insult to black people throughout the region," says a resolution passed at the NAACP's 35th annual regional conference Saturday.

### Amy Carter faces expulsion

PROVIDENCE, R.I. — Amy Carter is one of 20 students at Brown University facing expulsion today for disrupting a trustees meeting last month in an apartheid protest. If found guilty of violating campus rules, Carter 19, and the other also could get a reprimand, suspension or probation. Having encountered a boot of another kind from local police, the daughter of former President Jimmy Carter must pay \$305 in parking fines and other fees to get "Denver boot" taken off her car.
