REPORT FROM BSM

The second regular Black Student Movement meeting was called to order at 7:30 P.M. by Chairman Cureton Johnson on Thursday, October 8, 1970. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. Several reports and announcements were made.

The BSM decided not to try to get a team together for football. It was noted that the football season was just about over, so they decided to wait for basketball and softball to begin so that they can organize intramural teams at that time.

The BSM Chairman announced that there is money now available for speakers. Some of the suggestions were Cleveland Sellers, Jesse Jackson, Huey Newton, Nathan Hare, Julian Bond, Charles Hamilton, Julius Lester, Dick Gregory, and Dr. Rose Butler Brown of Durham.
