## College students can tutor through Campus Y

Would you like to spend an hour a day doing something that might help local students with their studies? If so, then the Campus Y tutoring program might be for you.

The program provides tutors for eight local schools: Carrboro Elementary School; Glenwood Elementary School; Estes Hill Elementary School; Ephesus Road Elementary School; Frank Porter Graham Elementary School; Seawell Elementary School; Culbreth Jr. High School and Phillips Jr. High School.

Cici O'Connor, one of three chairmen of the program, said it is designed to help Chapel Hill and Carrboro elementary and junior high school students with a variety of subjects.

O'Connor said the subjects are basic elementary and junior high school subjects — mathematics, science, social studies and English.

She said that in the past the program has been a great success but that success depends on the true commitment of the tutors.

"The tutors are dependable because they have a responsibility that goes further than tutoring, and they offer encouragement and friendship to the students," O'Connor said.

The importance of the elementary and junior high school students attending every tutoring session is stressed, she said.

The program always desires college students who are willing to dedicate themselves to two one-hour sessions per weeY, O'Connor said.

The members of the Freshman Class Committee for the academic year 1985-1986 are:


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
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The Freshman Class Committee is responsible for:
