"Don't be reluctant to join groups even if 48 of the 50 members are white because it is in those groups that you can really serve as role models," she said.

Willis agreed that blacks needed to become more active on campus. He said he thought all blacks should utilize the MA tutorials and that recruitment and retention of black students is a big problem here.

"I think this (better recruitment and retention) could be accomplished by more direct recruiting by the university itself and the implementation of the building of a black cultural center," Willis said.

Barnes said freshmen needed to realize the importance of academics because, "being academically sound can open doors for you."

"When your resume is looked at and people see you've done well at a university this competitive and challenging, they'll be more inclined to listen to what you have to say."
