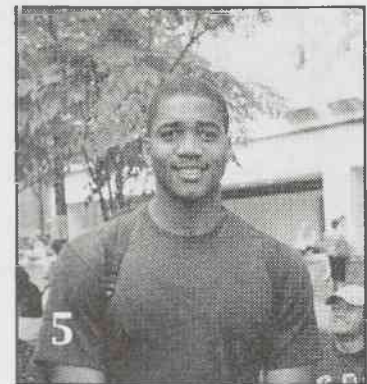
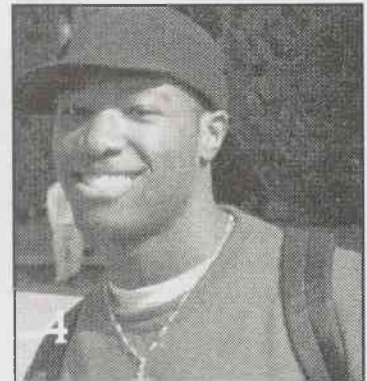


On the Yard:
