Caldwell Community College overcame a nine-point deficit in the second half Tuesday night and defeated the Lady Bulldogs, 81-78, in overtime.

Caldwell's Speck Spainhour led all scorers with 34 points. Teammates Henri Gettys and Adonna Hickman followed with 16 and 13.

Four Gardner-Webb players scored in double figures. Wing Rachel Albus topped the list with 20 points. Center Linda Cody finished with 16, 12 coming in the second half. Sherwin Johnson had 15 and Yana Bane popped in 10.

After trailing most of the first half, the Lady 'Dogs rallied from five points behind to grab a 35-34 lead at intermission. Despite being outshot from the floor, G-W stayed in contention by sinking 15 of 19 attempts from the foul line.

Three quick baskets by Cody padded the Gardner-Webb lead early in the second half. The margin reached nine on three occasions, the final time coming with 11 minutes to play when Albus put the Lady Bulldogs out front, 55-46.

At that point Caldwell came to life, outscoring G-W, 14-2, and streaking to a

60-57 advantage.

The lead exchanged hands four times down the stretch before time ran out with the two teams knotted at 71.

In the overtime, Gardner-Webb started the scoring by taking a 73-71 lead and held a 75-74 edge with 2:22 re-

Bolick Named To All-America Team

Bob Bolick, a four-year starter for the Bulldogs football team, has been named to the second team of the NAIA All-American squad and defensive back William Peppers has been named an honorable mention All-American.

Both were also selected to the All-South Atlantic Conference and All-District 26 teams.

Voted to the All-SAC-8 second team by the league coaches were sophomore running back Po Rogers and sophomore defensive end Monte Walker.

Bolick, 6-4, 260, is an offensive tackle who has attracted the interest of several professional teams. The

national football league draft will be held Feb. 3-4.

Also a senior, Peppers was the 'Dogs' most valuable defensive back as a sophomore and junior. He led the team in interceptions this season with four and picked off 14 during his career.

Rutherford, Lee Sign with 'Dogs

Greg Rutherford, a 6-3, 255-pound defensive tackle from Morganton, has signed a grant-in-aid with Gardner-Webb. He is the first high

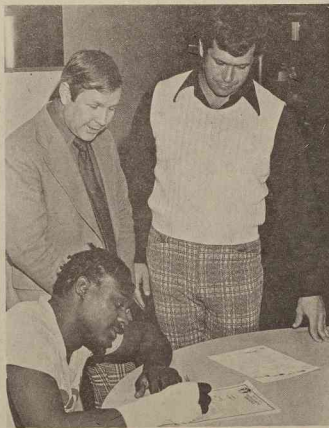
school recruit to sign with the Bulldogs.

Rutherford was an all-conference performer at Morganton's Freedom High where he was twice named player-of-the-week in North Carolina. The Patriots, 11-1 this past season, won the Western 4-A Conference championship and was eliminated by East Forsyth in the quarterfinals of the state playoffs.

"Greg ranked at the top of our list," said assistant coach Jim Gudger. "We feel he is one of the most outstanding defensive tackles we have ever seen. He has a very good chance of playing for us as a freshman."

Rutherford is the second recruit to be announced by the Bulldogs. Earlier head coach Oval Jaynes announced the signing of Alvin Lee of Shelby, who played free safety this past season as a freshman at Western Carolina.

Lee, a former running back at Crest who was heavily recruited by the Bulldogs as a high school senior, Lee is 6-2, 180-pounds. A 9.7 sprinter, he is capable of playing as a running back, defensive back or wide receiver.
