# GWU offers variety of majors

Some GWU students are finding themselves in 'major' limbo—that is, they are unsure as to what they will major in and what they will do with the major they choose. Gardner-Webb offers over 30 undergraduate programs in 15 departments, some of which students may not be aware of.

The following are the departments on campus and the undergraduate programs available in each:

Majors include: **American Sign Language, Communication Studies** (concentrations in Radio/TV, Electronic Publishing, Photography, Public Relations, Journalism and Theater), **English** (emphasis in Teaching, Writing, Pre-professional, and Theater Arts), and **Foreign Language** (ASL, French, and Spanish).

Majors dealing with the sciences are Math (majors with Teacher Licensure Requirements, Computer Science and a Dual-Degree Program in Engineering) and **Natural Sciences** (Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Medical Technology, Physician's Assistant and Physical Therapy).

The School of **Business** offers undergraduate degrees in Accounting, International Business, Business Administration, Management Information Systems and Finance.

Other majors include **Physical Education and Wellness/Sports Studies** (majors in Health/Wellness, Physical Education, Sports Management and Athletic Training).

The School of **Nursing** has an Associate Degree in Nursing, Bachelor of Science in Nursing and Master of Science in Nursing Programs.

A major in the **Religion** department could have a concentration in Religion, Biblical Languages and Literature, Education Studies and Youth Education Studies.

Other Majors include **Fine Arts** (majors in Music Education, Sacred Music and Music), **Psychology** and the **Social Sciences** (History, Social Science and Sociology).

The School of **Education** offer majors in Elementary Education and Middle Grades Education, as well as a minor in Professional Education.
