WLOZ mixes things up

Jonathan Sellers and "Perkdon" will perform their mix of tech-steppy jungle and acid jazz over the airwaves of WLOZ 89.1 Saturday nights from 10PM to midnight beginning January 22nd.

CD pick of the week

After years of obscurity, personal problems and ruptures within the group, Guns 'N' Roses is set to return in the music world. *Chinese Democracy* is set to be released this year by the completely restructured band. The only original member is lead singer Axl Rose. Until the new CD is released, fans can get their hands on *Guns 'N' Roses: Live Era '87-'93*, a new live album with songs recorded all over the world.

Among the twenty-two songs featured on the two-CD set are legendary favorites "Welcome to the Jungle", "Paradise City" and "Sweet Child O' Mine" from *Appetite for Destruction*, and a few songs from 1991's *Use Your Illusion I and II* most notably "You Could Be Mine" and "November Rain."

There are sixteen other songs every bit as good as the more popular tunes. On the first CD "Night Train" and "Mr. Brownstone" get the collection started. A couple of songs from their *G'N'R Lies* album follow, including "Patience" and "Used to be Her." Standout songs on the second CD include "Yesterdays," "Move to the City" and a cover of Bob Dylan's "Knocking on Heaven's Door."

The one drawback about the CD is the liner notes don't mention the exact venues and countries where the songs were played.

Whether *Chinese Democracy* proves to be worth the wait or extremely disappointing, the powerful live album promises takes fans back to the good old days of Gun's and Roses.
