While teaching at the University of Virginia (UVA), he was impressed with the honor code system as it was practiced there. At UVA each student was obligated to observe the system which entailed no lying, no stealing and no cheating. Students who disobeyed the Code and students who failed to report such offenders are equally guilty and were dealt with severely.

Because this code promotes trust between the students themselves as well as between the students and faculty, Geffert thinks that the enforcement of this type of honor code would be beneficial to St. Andrews, both

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
