
Regardless of age, everyone feels exhilaration when watching aerialists perform. This feeling can reach new heights while witnessing




Even the clowns at St. Andrews are invited to the circus.

Voter Registration Drive On Campus

The Americans for Democratic Action (ADA), a non-partisan political organization of St. Andrews is sponsoring a voter registration drive. The drive will take place on October 1, National Student Voter Registration Day, at 7:30 P.M. in the Belk Center. Judge Todd Williamson will officiate the registration process.

Students who wish to vote in Laurinburg are required to have six months residency at St. Andrews. This is the only legal requirement for in-state students who do not vote in another county. Those who are not considered residents of Scotland County can register in their home counties at the county Board of Elections on October 4.

Student ADA members urge you, the students, to register for and vote in the November election!
