#### **ALUMNI NEWS**

The Executive Committee of the General Alumni Association at its meeting in January, adopted the regulations listed below regarding the Student Loan Fund. Any student desiring to secure a loan from the fund should read carefully the regulations and then follow the procedures as outlined.

- 1. Those students recommended by the Registrar and Board as worthy of loan resulting from previous three-year record will be up for consideration.
- 2. Students under age will have to be endorsed by their parents.
- 3. There must be an agreement between student and loan board, properly signed and notarized, before loan can be consider-
- 4. There will be a fee of 6 per cent interest on all money loaned.
- 5. It will be agreed upon between student and Loan Board that before or not later than the fourth month of the first year of teaching, payment will begin and last until the end of each school year until bill is paid.
- 6. To receive a loan it will be futher agreed upon that students will teach at least one year or more until the said bill is paid.
- 7. Application must be made ninety days in advance for proper consideration.
