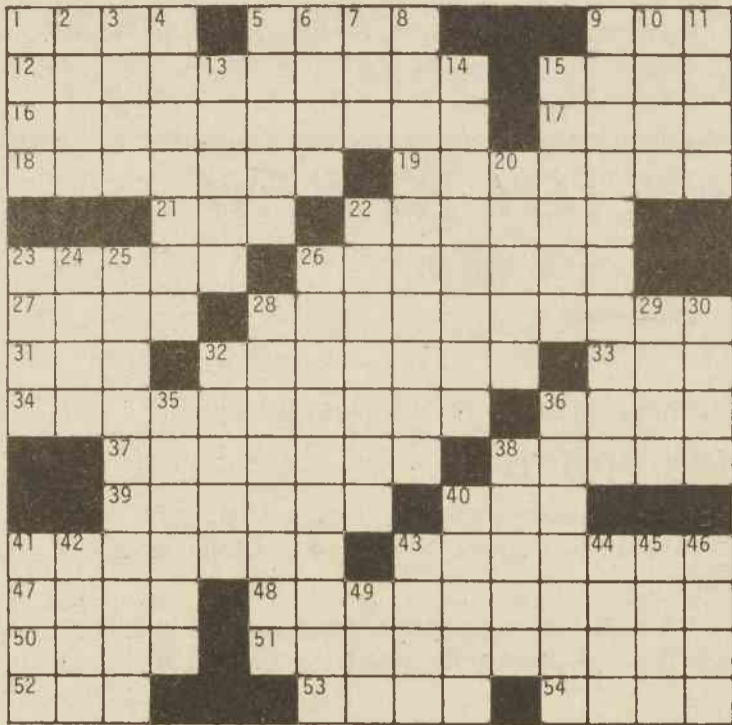

Career Week Set For Oct. 12-14

Approximately 60-80 representatives from businesses, school systems, government agencies, and graduate schools will participate in Career Week activities Oct. 12-14. The Youth Motivational Task Force Program and Career Exploration Day are part of the activities.

The purpose of the Youth Motivational Task Force is to increase minority and economically disadvantaged college students' awareness of employment opportunities available in the private sector. Minority personnel who are University alumni will spend three days visiting classrooms and meeting with faculty. These visits involve discussion of career options and the need to correlate education with career goal setting.

Career Exploration Day, which will be held October 14, is designed to allow interested students an opportunity to interface with representatives from business, school systems, government agencies, etc. This activity will be held in the C.E. Gaines Center.

Many consultants who have participated in the Career Exploration Day activities are now active in the on-campus recruitment program which is conducted annually by the Career Planning and Placement Office.
