The "Advisor of the Year" award was established in 1990. The two first recipients were Mrs. Dorothy A. Wallace, assistant professor of business, and Dr. G. Kenneth Wolfskill, professor of English.

Hill named honorary life Trustee

Bob F. Hill, Sr., of Murfreesboro, who began his service as a member of Chowan College's governing board more than 45 years ago, has been named Honorary Life Trustee, according to Bob F. Spivey of Windsor, chairman of the Board of Trustees.

Hill was first appointed to the Chowan board in 1949 when the college was re-opening after being closed for several years during World War II. He has been a member of the trustees almost continuously since 1972 except for the required one-year periods between terms.

A graduate of North Carolina State University with a degree in engineering, Hill is retired a president of Hill Enterprises, Inc., of Murfreesboro.

Active in the Murfreesboro Historical Association, Hill is the recipient of the Caraway Award for Historical Preservation and the Murfreesboro Exchange Club's "Book of Golden Deeds"
