Taylors establish lecture series

Dr. and Mrs. R. Hargus Taylor have established the "Heritage Lectures" fund to provide financial assistance in sponsoring lectures and programs on the campus.

"The lectureship will benefit the citizens of Murfreesboro and surrounding area as well as the Chowan community," said E. Vincent Tilson, vice president for development. "The lectures and programs made possible through the generosity of Hargus and Doris Taylor will, indeed, be cultural assets to this area."

Only the earnings of the fund will be applied toward a series of lectures and programs selected and sponsored by the college's Department of Religion and Philosophy.

"The focus of the 'Heritage Lectures' will be on religious personalities and movements as contributors to an understanding of the Judaeo-Christian heritage," said R. Clayton Lewis, director of corporate and foundation relations.

"Frequent emphasis is to be given to the contributions of Baptists," he continued.


