

James G. Garrison retires from football coaching; named Director of Braves Club AMES G. GARRISON, a coaching legend who guided Chowan College's athletic program from infancy into the ranks of NCAA Division III, ended his 37-year football coaching career with the Chowan Braves on June 1 to take on new responsibilities as Director of the Braves Club.

Garrison, who leaves a gridiron legacy and a coaching record which is unlikely to be matched or broken, will continue to serve as Vice President for Athletic Administration as well as teach several classes in physical education and coach the golf team.
