computers to meet the increasing need of computer services for students. The computer laboratories, cited as the "brain center of the campus," provide additional opportunities for students to have access to the latest computer equipment.

Because Chowan is a relatively small college with a faculty-stu-dent ratio of 16-1, students receive individual attention and the academic counseling they need to succeed at college. A relatively new course, College 101, is designed to orient freshmen to college life and build the skills they will need for success in the classroom.

Chowan also provides a department of academic support to help students complete collegelevel work through tutoring, learning laboratories, and other special services.

The college offers bachelor's degrees in business administration, commercial art, studio art, English, physical education, sports management, liberal studies, mathematics, music, printing production and imaging technology, religion and science. Teacher education degrees for K-6 and 9-12 are also offered as well as music education K-12, art educa-tion K-12 and health and physical education K-12

More than 30 associate degree programs are offered, including career education programs, computer information systems, preengineering, medical illustration, merchandise management and pre-athletic training.

"The high percentage named to the honors lists reflects the college's increased commitment to recruit students with the potential to excel in the classroom," Lowe said. "Our goal has always been to increase the quality of the student body, and this high percentage of honors students is an indication that we are doing that.'

According to Lowe, higher numbers of adult and day students, who tend to do very well, influence the outcome. But the real difference this year, other than the improving overall quality of Chowan's students, is the presence of a junior class.

"Our junior class has a lot to do with the increased percentage," Lowe said.

The bachelor's of applied science degree is offered by Chowan to those students transferring to the college with an associate in applied science degree or its equivalent from a program in a regionally accredited two-year college or technical school. This program is designed to fill a real need for persons who require an earned bachelor's degree for personal or job-related reasons.
