## Chowan's mace depicts heritage

lege Mace, one of the symbols which depicts the school's heritage, mission and religious affiliation, became more meaningful and symbolic when the college completed its transition and returned to four-year status.

Chowan's mace, like those of many other colleges and universities, signifies the dignity and authority of an institution of higher learning. Originally a mace was a stout club used as a weapon, but medieval universities adopted it as a symbol of order and authority and thus started the worldwide tradition.

The college's history and heritage may be traced in the mace's symbols. It first opened in 1848 as a four-year college for women as Chowan Baptist Female Institute, but in 1910 it was renamed Chowan College.

Men were first admitted as students in 1931, but the school became a two-year institution six years later as a result of financial difficulties during the depression years.

The Chowan mace is crafted in three sections and is made of solid walnut and ornamented with gold and silver.

Lewis suggested that the staff of the mace be a fluted column representing the historic Mc-Dowell Columns building and the nine pillars of Chowan support which are the Baptists of itage of Chowan.

The remaining sides of the mace's capital carry the Latin words trivium and quadrivium. These terms suggest the seven liberal arts as well as the two divisions of education in Roman schools.

The sphere of the mace symbolizes Chowan's universal dent body and its holistic approach to education. A band and flame comprise the finial.

Lewis, who also teaches a world history course in addition to his other duties at the college, points out that the flame portrays Chowan's experience as a source of intellectual and spiritual illumination.

The Chowan College Mace, first used at the graduation exercises several years ago, is now seen on special occasions during the academic year when it is carried in academic processions by the faculty marshal. Its placement and removal from a position of honor indicate the opening and closing of ceremonial

When not in use the mace is on exhibit in the antiquities room of Whitaker Library and may be viewed at any time.


Chowan College is strongly committed to educating the total student - mind, body and
