The Lady Braves volleyball and basketball teams will be coached by Jeannette Alston, who recently served as an assistant coach at South Carolina State University.

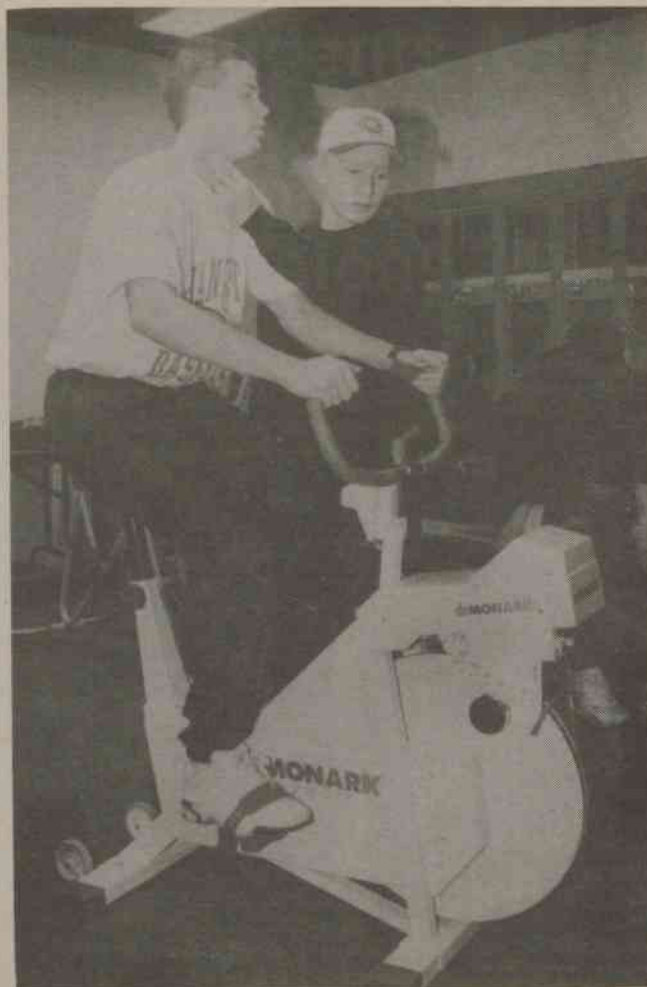
