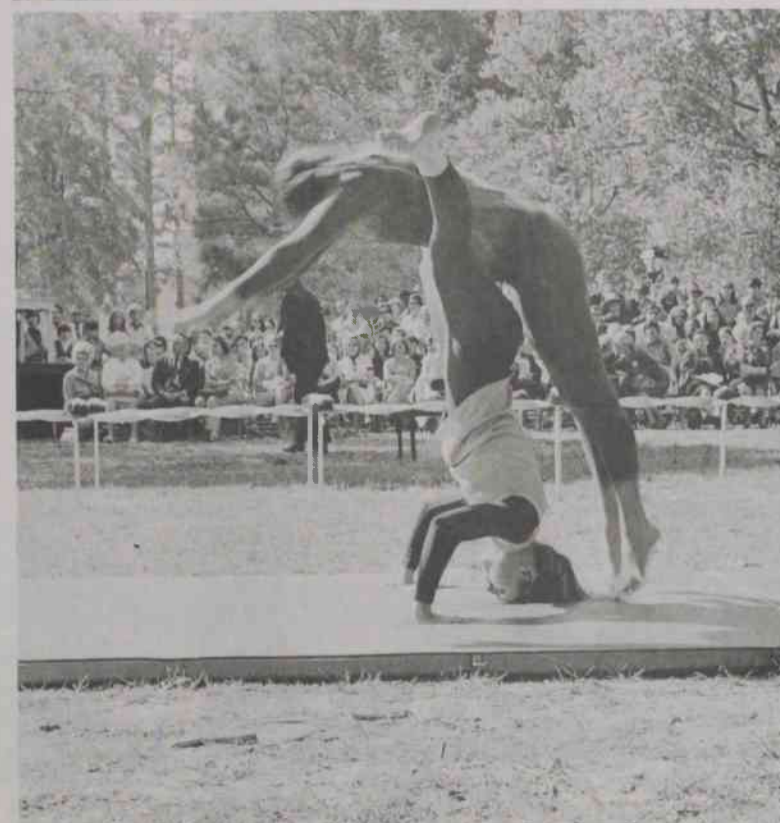
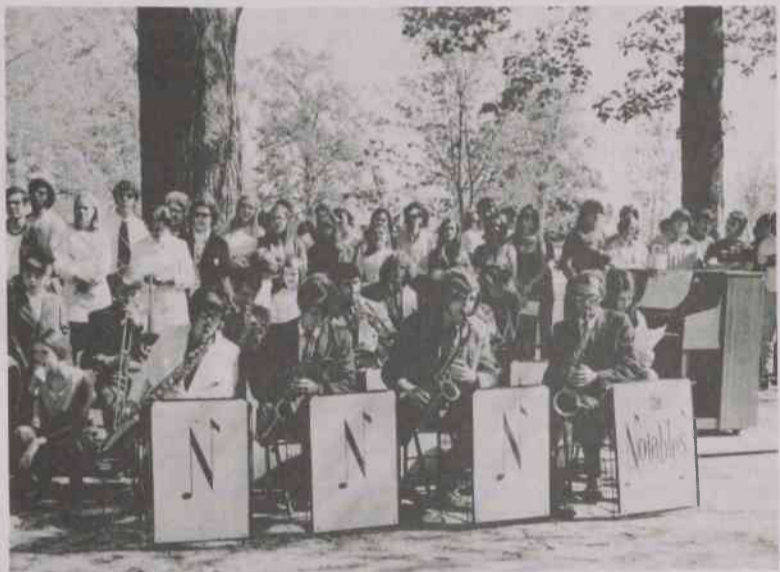

Scott Releases Study On Auto Insurance

RALEIGH, N.C. (AP) — Gov. Bob Scott released a study commission report Monday that recommends that North Carolina repeal its compulsory auto insurance laws and allow each insurance company to set its own auto liability rates.

The report comes from the Governor's Commission on Automobile Liability Insurance and Rates, created by the 1969 General Assembly and headed by Sen. Clyde Norton, D-McDowell.

Scott specifically endorsed several of the recommendations and said he would transmit the report to the legislature.

These are the major recommendations: —Beginning Dec. 1, 1972, auto liability rates be established on a "file and use" basis. Presently all companies must charge the rates fixed by the insurance commissioner.

The commissioner could still reject any company filing rates he judged "excessive, inadequate, discriminatory or destructive of competition or the public interest."

—Medical pay insurance coverage be made readily available to assigned risk drivers in limits of at least \$500 and "at a reasonable rate."
