NEWPORT NEWS, VA.- A driving baseline layup by freshman forward Johnny Johnson with 24 seconds remaining, and two free throws by freshman guard Mark Murdock with six seconds left, lifted Chowan College to a 71-69 non-conference basketball victory over Newport News Apprentice School, here Feburary 15 before a crowd of 26, thinned considerably by a strike at the shipyards

The Braves, who started and finished with an all-freshman lineup, wrapped up its regular season with a 21-5 record and began tournament play February 20 at Louisburg.

Chowan Coach Jerry Smith gave his regulars a rest for having a successful campaign, running his two-year record to 40-13 and posting an 8-0 league record for the second season. Smith said his freshmen deserved the start because they were so patient during the season,

The Brave freshmen, who were down by as much as 11 points in the game, rallied to tie at 59-all on a Ricky Lewis follow with 5:13 left. The game was tied four times before Johnson's bucket.

Lewis was the most impressive fresman for the Brave cause. The Virginia Beach native pumped in 14 points and hauled in 14 rebounds. Teammate Brien Armstrong also contributed 14.

Smith, beaming over his rookies' play said that the game was a lot of fun. "Those guys did a good job. When they were down, they kept right on fighting."

Newport News was led by Tom Bryant's game-high 20 points and Mark Crawford's 18.

Dr. B. Everard Blanchard of Chicago's DePaul University says that students who listen to music while filling out their test books generally are less anxious and get higher grades than those who don't have music in their classrooms.

According to Zodiac News Service, Blanchard divided 254 DePaul students with similar academic skills into three groups. He gave them all an exam, but had one group labor in silence while another group listened to classical music, and a third heard rock music.

The two groups listening to music, it turned out, had lower blood pressure and pulse rates during the test than the students who didn't hear music. They also ended up with higher grades on the test.


