The photographs on these two pages introduce a new teacher here at Chowan, Mark Wolfe of the photography department. He teaches freshman photography and is responsible for leading his students through the mysteries of image making.

Wolfe comes to Chowan from Rochester Institute of Technology where he studied Black and White, Color Photography, Commercial Photography, Advertising, Filmmaking, Television Production and Direction, Computer Graphics, Graphic Film Production, and Animation. He has been an avid photographer for more than ten years and has worked in a wide variety of photographic jobs. While at RIT, he also taught a course in animation and film.
