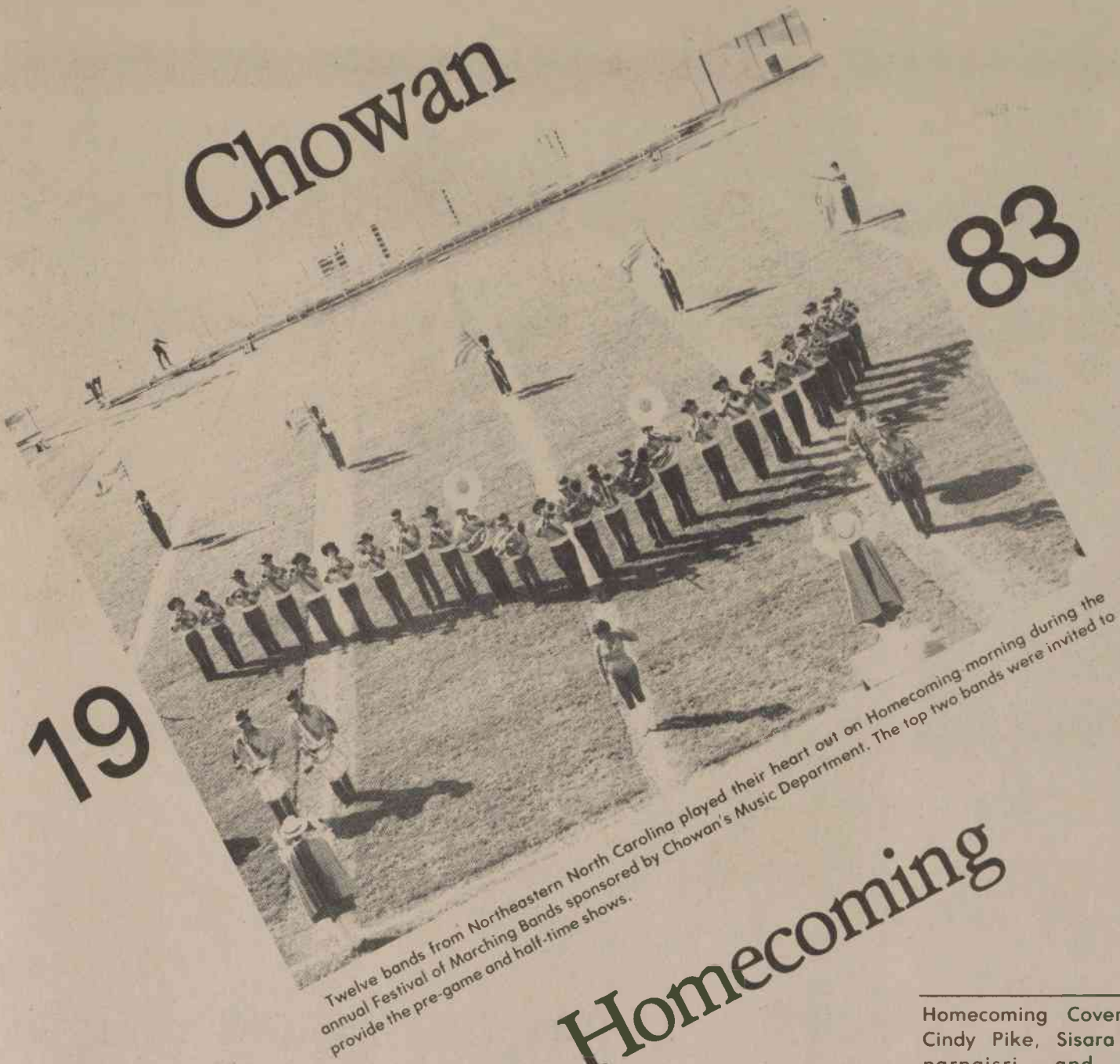

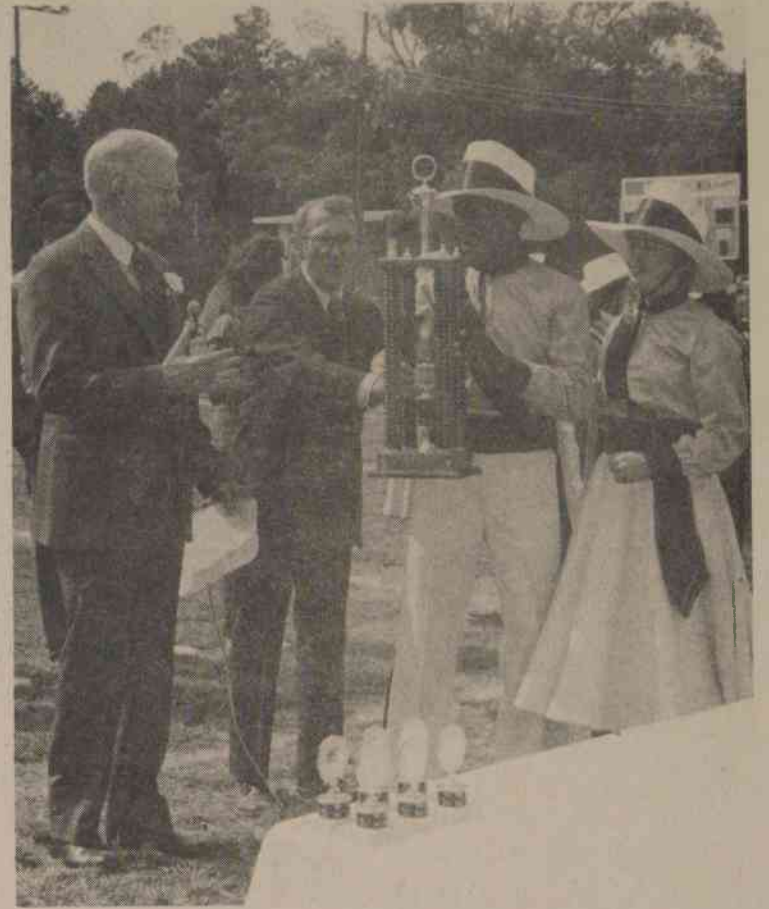

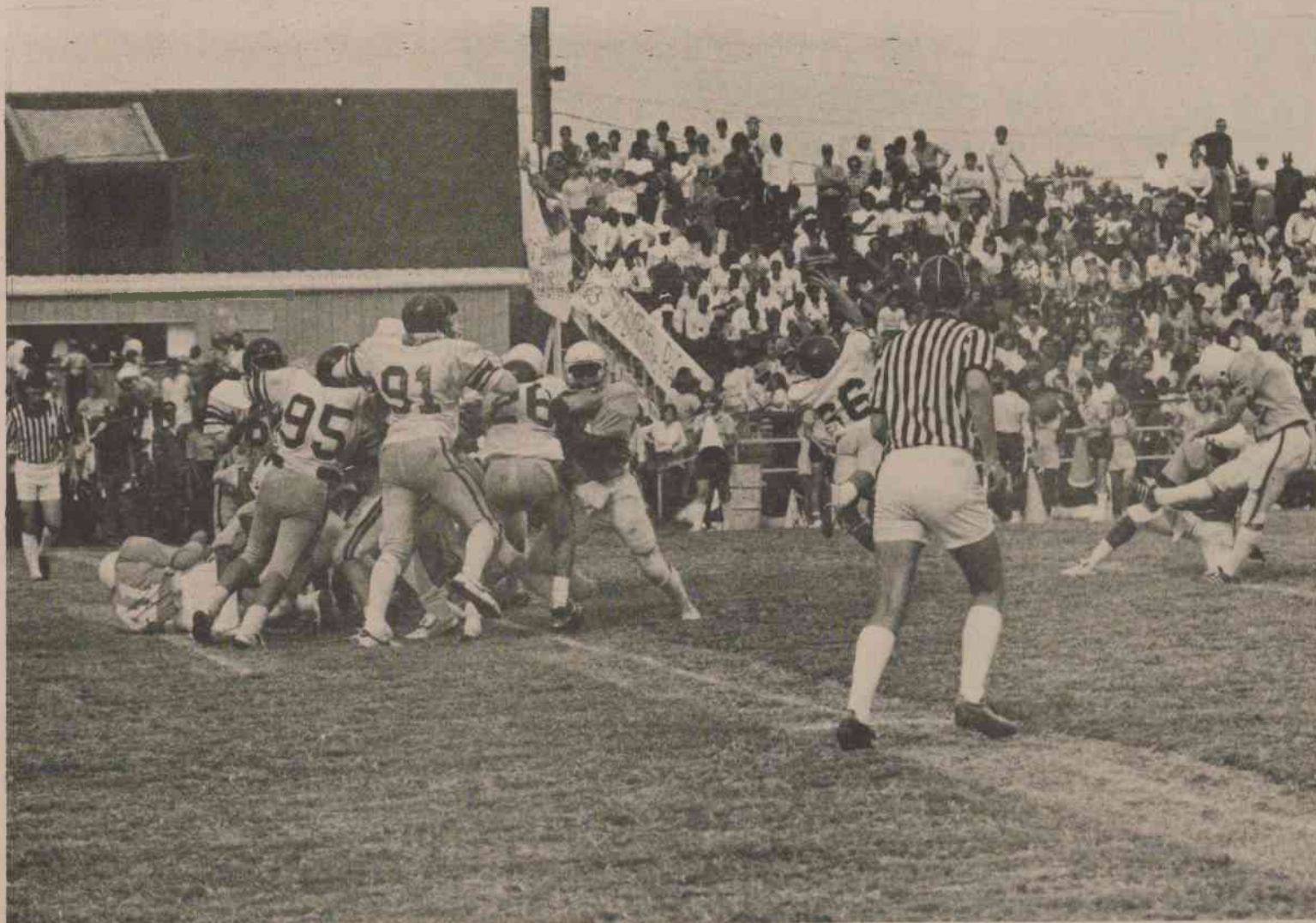

MURFREESBORO, N.C....Perquimans High School band members recieved the Band of the Day trophy from Chowan College President Bruce E. Whitaker, left, and music professor Bob Brown after the Perquimans band placed first in the Fall Festival of Marching Bands held as part of Chowan's homecoming activities. Perquimans won from a field of 12 bands and received a \$500 cash award by Belk-Tyler Stores of eastern North Carolina. Chowan Stadium was filled for the annual event sponsored by Chowan's Fine Arts Department and coordinated by Brown. Winners in Division A for bands of 60 or less members were Northern Nash, first; Manteo, second; and Northampton East, third. In Division AA for larger bands, Perquimans placed first, John A. Holmes of Edenton was second, and Apex was third. Following the band festival, Northern Nash and Perquimans presented the pre-game and half-time shows respectively as Chowan defeated Ferrum, 27-7, in a Coastal Conference football game.
