

### VALERIE BETTIS TEACHING HERE

Valerie Bettis, the well-known dancer-actress, is at the School of the Arts for two weeks to work with dance students.

Miss Bettis has worked as a dancer, actress, and choreographer on Broadway, off-Broadway, in television, in films, in this country and abroad.

Her solo work in "The Desperate Heart" was called the best solo of the year by John Martin of the New York Times.

She played "Tiger Lily" in "Inside U.S.A." and created the acclaimed dance-theater piece "As I Lay Dying," based on the story by William Faulkner.

Miss Bettis has done dances for films, including several for Rita Hayworth, with whom she has performed. She replaced Lotte Lenya in "The Three-Penny Opera" during its run at the Theater de Lys in New York City.

She has also played in the touring company of "Back to Methuselah," with Tyrone Power, Faye Emerson, and Arthur Treacher.

Her first off-Broadway choreographic-staging job was for "Ulysses in Nighttown," based on James Joyce's "Ulysses."


### School Rings
