Sports Program Will Be Varied

This year's Physical Education program under Mr. Donald Scalf will divide freshmen and sophomores into different activities. For the first eight weeks the freshmen classes will participate in basketball while upperclassmen will endeavor to play tag football. For the remaining eight weeks the freshmen will attempt to show their skills at tag football and the sophomores will participate in soccer.

There will be no intramurals, as such, offered for women this semester. However, Mrs. Edge will be available every Tuesday at four o'clock in order to organize teams for competitive sports for those women who are interested.

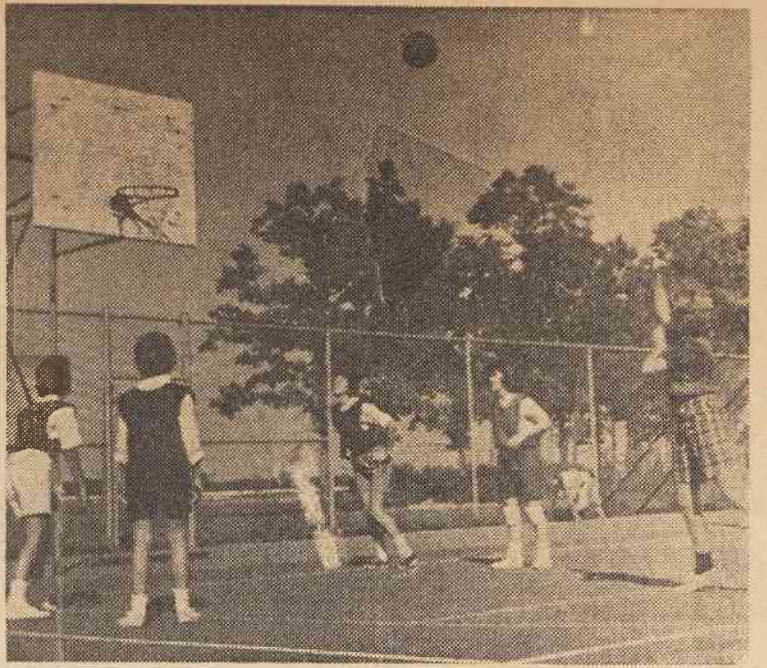
course designed with emphasis on individual case studies. This course will aid teachers in the organization of materials and procedures for remedial and developmental reading programs.
