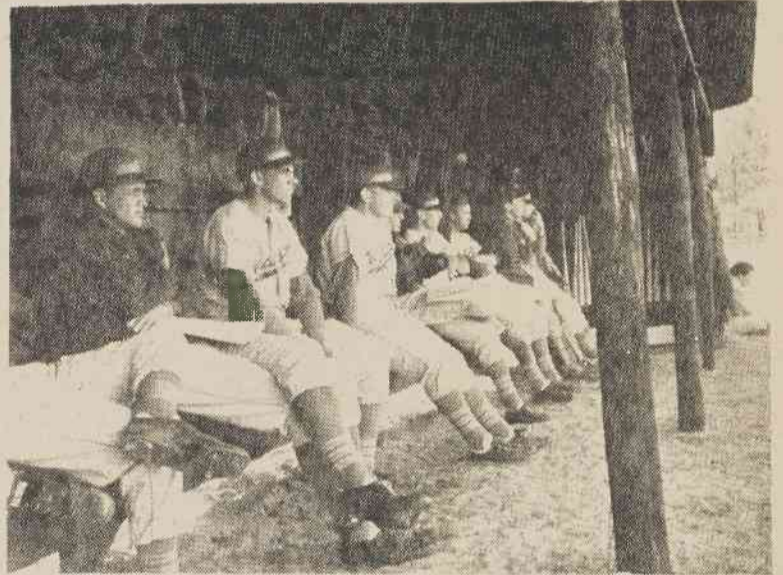
## WOMEN CLASH IN POWDER PUFF FOOTBALL

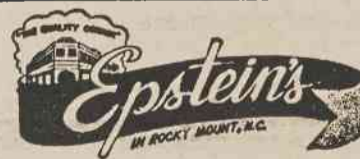
