d. Freshman Women's Residence Hall.

1. A president elected by the residences of the residence hall.

2. Two counselors on each floor who must maintain residence on that floor during that term of office, elected by the residents of that floor.  
a. On the first floor, one counselor must come from the right side and one from the left side of the residence hall lounge.

b) On the second and third floor, the counselors may come from the floor at large.

3. An adviser who shall be the assistant resident counselor from the residence hall and who shall have no vote.

Article X. To delete Sections 1,2,3, and 4 and to substitute in their place:

1. Student Government Association officers, class officers, Senators.

a. Nominations

1) Any person desiring to hold any of these offices must file his application with the Elections Committee at least two weeks prior to the date set for the election of that office.

2) The form of the application shall be determined by the Elections Committee.

3) The application must be signed by 5% of the body which the office represents.

4) The Elections Committee shall be responsible for determining whether or not the

applicant meets the requirements of the office that he desires to hold.

5) If the applications for any particular office exceed three, they will be limited to this number by a plurality vote on the Tuesday following the deadline for applying.

b. Elections

1) Student Government Association officers: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Attorney General

a) The election shall be held on the second Friday in March.  
b) The person with the majority of vote will be elected.

c) The elections shall be by secret ballot.

d) If no one candidate receives a majority of votes, a runoff shall be taken on the following Monday.

e) Campaign speeches must be made during Assembly on the Tuesday preceding the day of elections.

2) Sophomore, Junior, and Senior Class Officers

a) Elections shall be held on the first Friday in May.

b) The voting procedure shall be determined by the Elections Committee.

3) Freshman Class Officers

a) The Elections shall be on the third Friday in October.

b) The voting procedure shall be determined by the Elections Committee.

4) Upperclass Residence Halls and Day Students Senators

a) Elections shall be held on the second Friday in October.

b) The voting procedure shall be determined by the Elections Committee.

5) Freshman Residence Halls Senators.

a) The election shall be held on the last Friday in October.

b) The manner of elections shall be determined by the Elections Committee.
