Oliveria and Sanderson Receive Dixie Conference Honors

For the second week in a row the Dixie Conference has selected two Bishops as Soccer Players of the Week.

This was the second consecutive week that Shaun Oliveria (Sr. / Midfielder, Richmond, VA / Mills Godwin H.S.) has been named the Men's Soccer Player of the Week. Caitlin Sanderson (Sr. / Midfielder, Neptune, NJ / St. Rose) was selected as the Women's Soccer Player of the Week.

Oliveria led the Bishops to their third tournament championship of the season. The Bishops tied Washington & Lee one goal apiece and defeated Bethany 4-2 to win the Methodist College Invitational. He was shut out during the first match but scored a goal in the match against Bethany.

During the week, the Bishops lost to Mary Washington 2-3, with Oliveria scoring both goals for Wesleyan. NCWC's record now stands at 5-2-1, which is one win away from their win total of a year ago.

In a 4-0 win over Averett
University, Sanderson
scored a goal and had two
assists. The very next day,

she came back with one goal and three assists in a 9-0 blanking of Ferrum College. The Bishops now stand at 4-2 overall and 2-0 in the Dixie.


