## VACATION CHECKS

Vacation checks were delivered on June 24 to 1,976 employees of Adams-Millis Corporation. The total vacation pay was \$88,301.71.

Your individual checks are based on length of service with the company. Those employees who had completed five years of continuous service on, or before, April 1 of this year received 4% of their earnings for the six months period beginning October 1 of last year to April 1 of this year. Those employees with one to five years of continuous service on April 1 received 2% of their earnings for the same six months period. Of the total 1,976 employees receiving vacation pay, 1,427 received 4% and 549 received 2%.

Vacation pay is paid to Adams-Millis employees twice each year. The winter vacation checks are paid immediately preceding Christmas week and are based on the period from April 1 to October 1.
