

BASCOM JARRELL RETIRES



Bascom E. Jarrell, Plant #1, retired recently on the 43rd anniversary of his employment with Adams-Millis Corporation.

Born in Randleman in 1882, Mr. Jarrell went to work as boiler tender for Randleman Manufacturing Company at the age of 12 years. He moved to High Point in 1912 and started to work at the Piedmont Hosiery Mill as a fireman and watchman. Later, the Piedmont was consolidated with Adams-Millis and Jarrell continued his duties as fireman-watchman, working continuously until his retirement in October. Altogether he has had 60 years of experience tending boilers and 12 years of experience in maintenance repair work.

Mr. Jarrell married the former Bessie Smith of Randleman, by which marriage he has five children. One of his sons, Horace, is a fixer at Plant #1.

A familiar and highly respected employee of Plant #1, Mr. Jarrell has not been actively at work for several months due to his health. However, he is still very active and has plans to paint his house soon and then visit with his children. He now resides at 944 Council Street and attends Wesley Memorial Church.

A participant in the Profit Sharing Plan, Jarrell received an immediate payment of \$1,000.00, with a balance of approximately \$3,000.00 to be paid later.

EMPLOYEES CONTRIBUTE TO UNITED FUND

During the recent city-wide United Fund Drive, employees of Adams-Millis Corporation pledged the largest amount to the United Fund in the history of the company.
