

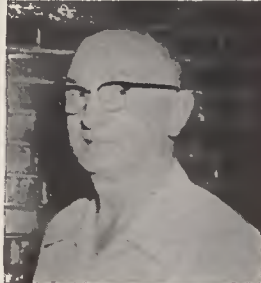
## YOUR INQUIRING COLUMN
