Adams-Millis Corporation is the largest property tax payer in the City of High Point. Taxes levied against the company last year led all other property holders. The levy was \$95,518.09, which is about one per cent of property within the old city limit.

In Kernersville, Adams-Millis Corporation is the second largest tax payer with property tax bill of \$10,933.38. The Adams-Millis tax bill represents eight per cent of taxes levied in Kernersville.
