

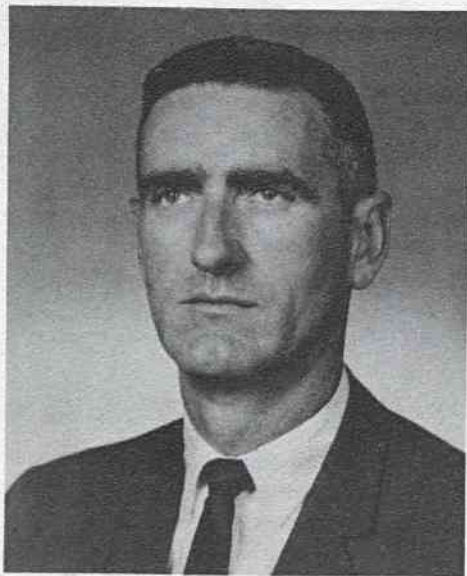

DON CREEDE NAMED PRESIDENT MAC PANEL *Craycroft Sales Manager*



Donald V. Creede has been promoted to the office of President of MAC Panel Company, Electronics Division of Adams-Millis Corporation.

Creede assumed responsibility for the operations of MAC Panel upon the resignation of George L. Athanas, who entered private business.

Creede served as vice president in charge of sales for MAC prior to his recent promotion. In his new position, Creede has assumed over-all responsibility for MAC's operations, which include the manufacture and sale of control panels, wires and magnetic computer tape, and more recently, the manufacture and sale of disk packs.

He will be assisted by Frank C. Stewart, vice president in charge of production of digital computer tape and magnetic disk packs. He will also be assisted by Fred Long, who is in charge of MAC's production of control panels, wires and complete programming systems.
