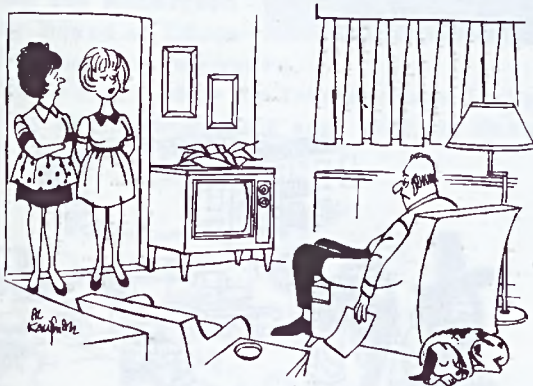
Ilene Benson
