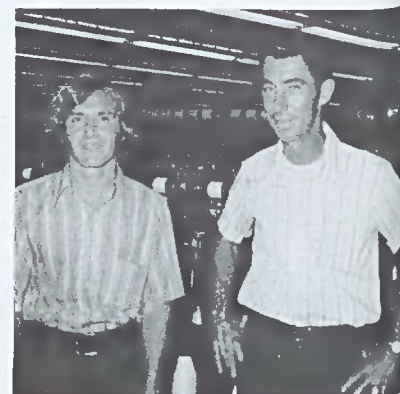
Mike, his wife (Emmetta) and son (Mike) now reside in Raeford. In his spare time, Mike enjoys golfing and fishing.
