JOE SKEEN

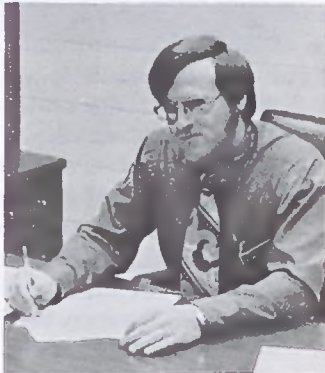
