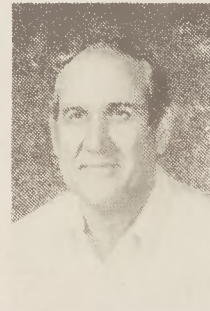

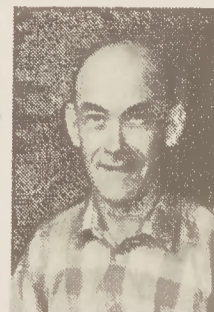

Ryan who carried it on to Elm Street in front of Adams-Millis Headquarters to the applause of Adams-Millis employees and others gathered along the torch route.

Ryan was followed closely by several Adams-Millis employees who carried a banner which read "Adams-Millis Salutes The Olympic Festival."

At the end of the block, Ryan passed the torch to a young woman in a wheelchair to continue on its journey to the Festival's opening ceremonies a few days later in Carter-Finley Stadium in Raleigh.

During its trek through North Carolina, which began in Wilmington, the torch was carried by thousands of runners.

"It was a pleasure for Adams-Millis to be associ-

ated with such a fine event as a bronze sponsor," Millis said. "I am proud too that many of our employees were

able to be part of it as well." The Festival was the most successful one ever conducted in its history.
