"But I am pleased to report that we in the hosiery industry are not just holding our own, but in many ways are setting the standards worldwide for hosiery manufacturing. While other industries have lost large segments of their markets, the hosiery industry has set new records in the last three years for production and sales. You are winning the battle where it counts . . . At the retail counter."

As for the future, Millis predicts there will be greater demand "to have the right product, the right promotion and be in the right place at the right time."

He said being flexible and quick to respond to market demands will be even more important.

He ascribes to the theory that, "Some people make it happen. Some people watch it happen. Some people say 'What happened.'"

"We must be among those who make it happen," he said.



Caudill has held several offices in the NAA chapter since it was chartered including vice president of communication, director of community projects (two years), director of communications (two years), and team captain (two years).


