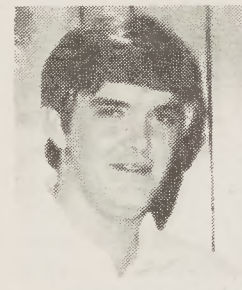


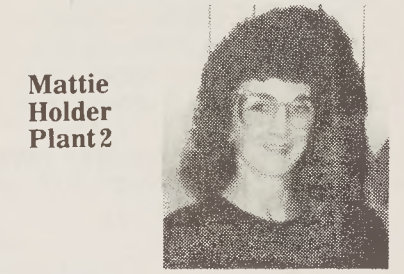

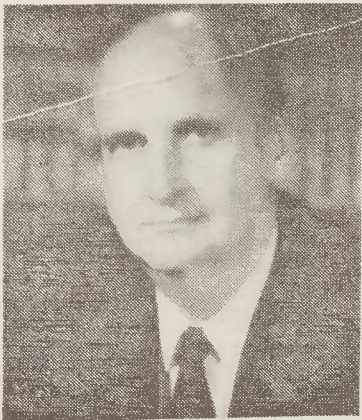
Connelly will be based in High Point and will report to Norman Weiss, President of Adams-Millis Sales Company.
